

JESUS SCOLDS KING HEROD

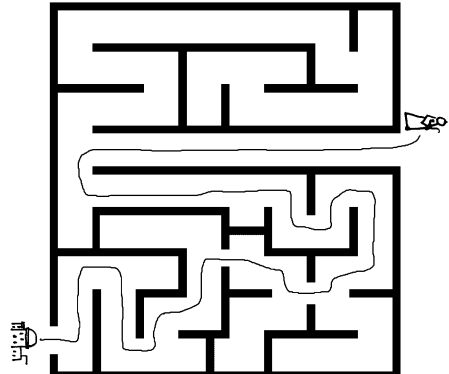
(On the way to Jerusalem) — Jesus was heading to Jerusalem, where he knew he would die for the world. On the way some people stopped him and said, “Don’t go to Jerusalem. King Herod lives there. He wants to kill you.”

Jesus knew there would be trouble in Jerusalem. But he decided not to stay away just because King Herod was there. In fact, Jesus called the king “a fox.” He told the people who had warned him, “Go back to Herod and tell him that God’s power is flowing through me. I am doing miracles and big crowds are coming to listen to my teaching.”

Jesus was sad to think that the people in Jerusalem were always unfriendly to God’s messengers. Often God’s messengers were killed when they went to Jerusalem.

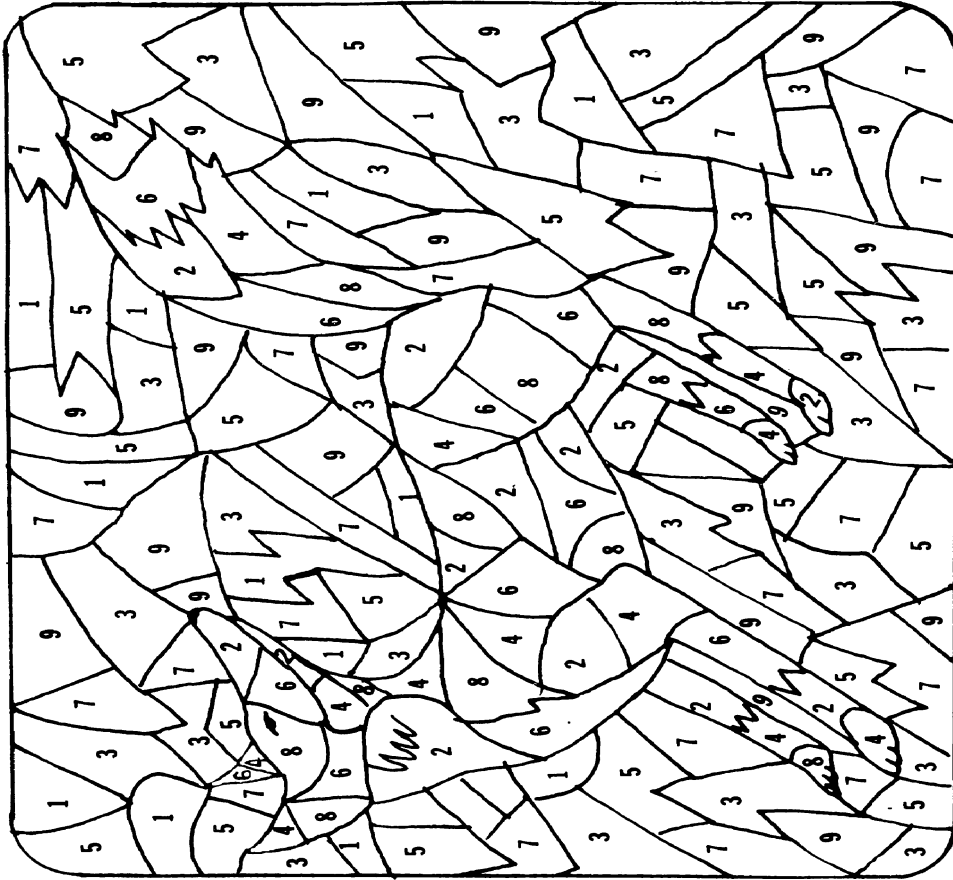
