bread of life. Jesus is “Living Bread” come down from heaven.

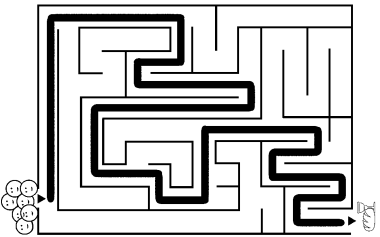
She also explained that Jesus gave this bread — his body — for us when he died on the cross. That sounded a little bit scary, but it also sounded awesome to Jimmy and Matt.

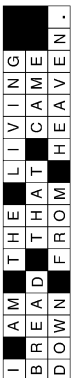
Questions

What did the teacher tell them about Jesus?

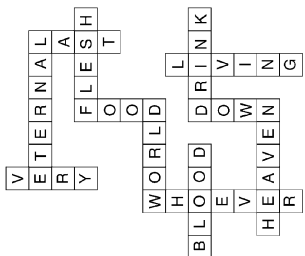
Jesus said, “I live because of the Father.” What does he mean by this?

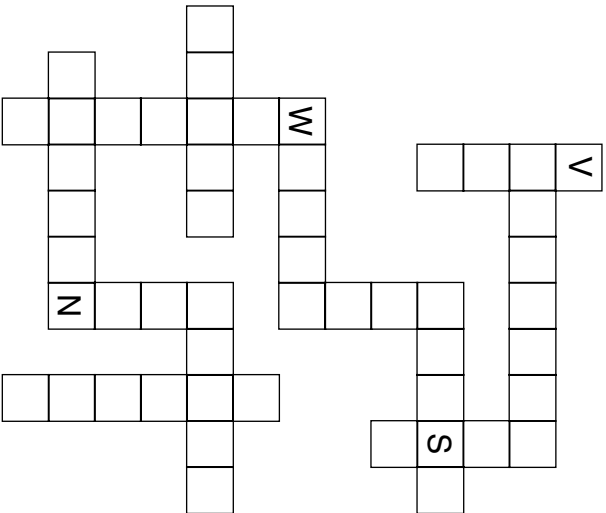

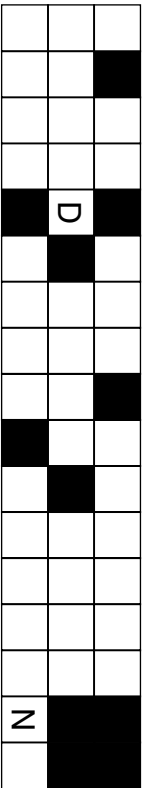
